"What Is Your Purpose in Life?" -pt4

Characteristics

At one point it appeared as if **both** men were **headed** for the **same destiny**... on the **same** course of **corruption**. **Hitler** wanted to **kill** the **Jews**, and **Paul** (Saul) wanted to **kill** the **Jews** who had become **Christians**—to **kill** the early **church**—to **squelch** its **impact**, dragging them off to **prison**. **Both** believed they were **serving** God.

• But Paul would one day **find** the better **path**, **follow** it... and be forever **changed**.

"There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death." Proverbs 14:12

What Are Roads to Nowhere?

As a young man, Paul thought he was fulfilling his purpose in life when...

... "he began to destroy the church" Acts 8:3

A zealous Pharisee in the early days of the church, he went house to house to find followers of Jesus Christ / and imprison them. He stood by and watched while Stephen, the first Christian martyr, was stoned for his faith—consenting to his death.

But his **fight** against Christians **ended** when he **saw** the risen Christ, / his real **purpose** in life **began**. "Still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples" Acts 9:1, Paul was traveling to **Damascus** and was on the **outskirts** of the city **when** a "light from heaven flashed around him" Acts 9:3.

Jesus **showed** that he wasn't just **persecuting** the **church**, but was **really** persecuting **Jesus**. **Later**, Jesus said of Paul...

"This man is my chosen instrument to carry my name before the Gentiles/ their kings/ before the people of Israel." Acts 9:15

Paul was beaten for his beliefs, imprisoned for his purpose, in chains for his choice—clearly he chose Christ. The Roads to <u>Emptiness</u>

You are chasing after the wind and on a road to emptiness if you are...

- Externally-focused... concerned about your own outward appearances of success—egotism
- Materialistic... impressed with money and possessions—<u>materialism</u>
- Pleasure-seeking... seeking happiness as your highest goal in life—<u>hedonism</u>
- Task-oriented... placing projects over people—<u>workaholism</u>
- Insecure... pleasing **people** to gain **acceptance**—<u>idolatry</u>
- Negative... dissatisfied, disinterested, bored, and bitter—<u>pessimism</u>
- Escaping reality... numbing reality through alcohol, food, drugs, activities—<u>escapism</u>
- Status-seeking seeking fame, power or intellectualism as your highest goal in life—<u>elitism</u>
